



We have been back to the Bryan campus four times since the early 1960s when we were students here. On each visit Barb and I have experienced a thrill that has nothing to do with nostalgia. Each visit has been for us a revival of spirit and renewal of purpose in our lives. We had only glimpses on those brief visits, but now that we live and work here we are learning first hand the reasons why Bryan has always been special in our lives (besides the fact that we met here!).

Anyone driving on to the campus, whether they are students, alumni, or guests for special conferences or programs at the college, is captivated by the warm, friendly atmosphere reflected by all who work on the campus. In fact, it is hard to visit Bryan Hill without thinking, "I belong here. Everyone here cares about me. Not just some with whom I have personal contact, but from the president to the grounds and maintenance workers, everyone here cares about me."

The college motto, "Christ Above All," inspires the practical application of Christ-like love and hospitality that is shown toward any visitor. But the returning Bryan alumni feel all this and more. Perhaps it is like that "back to Bethel" revival that was so important in the life of Jacob. God spoke to Jacob at Bethel. I know that, for many Bryan alumni, the Lord spoke to them at Bryan and began to reveal His will and purpose in their lives.

As students we spent many evenings gazing out over the beautiful Tennessee valley, meditating on the Creator of this ruggedly lush landscape and asking His guidance in our lives. Now, as alumni, this same scene reminds us of His faithfulness in

Alumni Active in Tennessee's Fastest Growing County

There have been striking changes in the last twenty years on the local scene in Rhea County. All of the changes are positive and Bryan has played a part in some of them. The influence of Bryan alumni is most obvious in the Rhea County school system. County Department of Education statistics show that 30 per cent of Rhea County's teachers are Bryan graduates. Many others have completed certification requirements or have taken professional advancement courses at the college. Certainly Bryan grads carry a positive spiritual influence to any public school system, but it is especially obvious in the Rhea county schools. Another tremendous boost in local public education was the opening in 1975 of a brand new consolidated high school which now has over 1200 students enrolled.

Over 330 Bryan alumni are now living in Rhea county, the fastest growing county in Tennessee over the past ten years. The population of the county has increased by 40 per cent from

1970-1980, and by 52 per cent in the past twenty years.

Bryan students and faculty have always been active in local churches. This is also true of Bryan alumni who worship and serve in some of the more than 86 churches in Rhea County.

A burgeoning local economy undergirds the changes we have noted. Bryan graduates are active in the business and industry of the community which boasts over 26 industries employing almost 4,600 workers. And this does not include the Nuclear Plant scheduled to open soon at Watts Bar Dam.

The local changes have been marked and good. We can praise the Lord that Bryan College and its alumni have been able to be a part of growth and change in the local community. If you are returning to the college for the first time in ten or twenty years, you will notice these changes as you drive toward the campus.

keeping the promises He revealed to us at Bryan, and how He kept them later, no matter how unattractive and depressing some of life's problems became.

Beyond the physical campus setting the people of the supporting staff, the professors at Bryan are the greatest reminder of God's faithfulness. They stir the memory of "those things which thou hast learned." When you meet Bryan professors you had years ago, you don't think of how hard the tests were, but you think how valuable a part of your life their teaching and sharing has become. Remember the prayer beginning each class? You probably know now that your professors prayed for you aside from the classroom setting. And the returning alumnus is living evidence of the answer to each professor's prayer and the prayers of every member of this campus. If you didn't know it as a student, you will realize as a returning Bryan alumnus that their prayer is that each individual leaving the campus puts "Christ Above All" in his or her daily life.

But the fullness of blessing comes through sharing it. If you haven't returned for a visit to the Bryan campus, we urge you to do so. Barb and I know that for you, too, "back to Bryan" can be a "back-to-Bethel" experience in your life. And as God used Bryan College to teach you in the first place, He can also use it to remind you of His faithfulness.

Alumni Challengers Offer \$20,000 Pledge


Layne Roberts, doctor of osteopathy, states his interest in supporting Bryan as follows:








